Curricula Developed at Auburn University:

I served on the committee that developed the proposal for the Ph.D. program in Human Development and Family Studies. Work on this committee included conceptualization of the focus of the program, the content and objectives of the program, course development, assessment of existing resources and additional resources required to develop the program, and a statement of the relationship of the program to the mission of Auburn University. The goal of the Forum is to provide a venue for undergraduates to present their research to the broader university community. Teaching Evaluations at Auburn University:

Teaching effectiveness was determined using the Auburn University Teaching Effectiveness Survey. The questionnaire was administered to the students in my courses and returned to the Dean's office without being seen by me. Response choices for the eight items ranged from 1, "strongly disagree" to 5, "strongly agree." The average instructor rating over the past ten years across my undergraduate and graduate courses was 4.83 (Undergraduate = 4.75, Master's level = 4.85, Doctoral level = 4.88). These ratings indicate that regardless of the course being evaluated or the question being asked, students' overwhelming response was "strongly agree."
